

Laurinburg/Scotland County Drug and Crime Committee

Ex officio members would include a representative from

1. The Sheriff's Department (preferably an individual well-versed in gang activity)
2. The City Police Department
3. The Court System
4. Scotland County Schools

Ex officio members would provide input and an overall update on what crime and drug activity is going on in the community and the challenges they present in the area of enforcement.

Meetings would be held once monthly at 7 p.m. in different locations throughout the County.

The City and County each would be responsible for appointing six to 10 individuals to the Drug and Crime Committee. Appointments would be made through the application process or directly through recruitment by elected officials. Appointments should be made in September.

The organizational structure would be discussed at first meeting in October.

City resources would be used as needed.

The Committee would make recommendations on how crime and drug usage in Scotland County might be reduced. The Committee would develop ideas and methods to put into action to improve the quality of life for all residents of Scotland County.
