Scotland County operates five conveniently located recycling and solid waste collection centers. Each center features receptacles to accept a number of items, which can be separated as follows:

Boxes — all corrugated packing boxes, shoe boxes, cereal and cracker boxes, tissue and toy boxes, paper towel tubes and paper egg cartons. If it came in cardboard, it can be recycled!

Magazines— and other “slicks” such as catalogs.

Mixed household and office paper — junk mail, computer paper, paper bags, dog food and livestock bags and office and school miscellaneous paper of all colors.

White goods— appliances such as washing machines, refrigerators, dish washers and dryers.

Swap Shop items — clothes, small appliances, toys and furniture that can be used by other patrons.

Household hazardous waste — used motor oil, transmission fluid or antifreeze, paints and solvents, residential pesticides and herbicides, furniture stripper and preservatives and swimming pool chemicals.

Automobile items — car batteries, tires and used motor oil.

Plastics — #1 through #7 all clean consumer plastic. Oil containers and antifreeze containers must be paid for.

Yard waste — limbs, leaves, pine straw. **Nothing over six-foot long is accepted.**

Glass — food and beverage containers such as bottles and jars that are green, brown and clear.

Newspaper— and all inserts must be separated from other recyclable paper products.

Aluminum and steel cans — are accepted as well as **clean** aluminum foil and pie plates.

There is a fee for styrofoam containers because they are not recyclable. Please consider purchasing products in recyclable containers.

Farmers may discard triple rinsed agricultural pesticide containers. Contact the Cooperative Extension at 910-277-2442 for more information.

All items on these pages can be recycled free of charge except where noted.

Scotland County Recycling Centers serve all citizens including residents of Laurinburg, East Laurinburg, Gibson, Wagram and a portion of Maxton. Think **RECYCLING** at your house!
